Development Bank of Zambia Disburses K87, 192,136.04 in 2016 to Small and Medium Enterprises

(Lusaka: 27/01/2017) The Development Bank of Zambia (DBZ) disbursement an amount of K87,192,136.04 to 23 SME's in 2016, as a way of contributing to Zambia's development.

The provision of funds to SME's contributed to national development by creating quality jobs, infrastructure development, and improved service delivery among many other things.

The distribution of funds per sector was as follows; Agriculture K24,083,688.39, Agro Processing K21,282,957.81, Tourism and Hospitality K14,886,026.21, Manufacturing K3,562,553.55, Construction K12,323,664.57, and other services with K11,053,245.51.

From the breakdown above, it could be noted that the agriculture and agro-processing sectors had received more support compared to other sectors. The support to the two sectors was increased in line with government's plan of making agriculture and agro-processing the mainstay of the economy.

As a Bank, we will continue sourcing for cheap lines of credit, so that we continue providing funds to SME's at a lower interest rate compared to other players in the financial sector.
